

REQUESTING ACCOMMODATIONS

A qualified individual with a disability in the context of post-secondary education is a student who meets the academic and technical standards requisite to admission or participation in Gnomon's programs and activities. It is the responsibility of the student with the disability to contact the acting Title IX Representative to provide appropriate documentation and to request needed accommodations in a timely manner.

The documentation will be assessed per Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and the Americans with Disabilities Act as Amended of 2008.

Every effort will be made to implement reasonable and effective accommodations. Requests for accommodations that are not supported by appropriate documentation or that fundamentally alter the school's programs or requirements will be denied. Last updated: April 12, 2012

Example of support services or accommodations designed for students with disabilities:

- Alternative exam formats or additional time
- Tutors to assist with ongoing coursework
- Readers, classroom notetaker or scribes
- Registration assistance or priority class registration
- Adaptive equipment or technology: Assistive listing devices or talking computers
- Sign language interpreters/translators
- Course substitution waivers
- Textbooks on tape

Please be aware that California state law prohibits tape recording someone without their permission. A student must notify the professor when there is a request to use a tape recorder.
